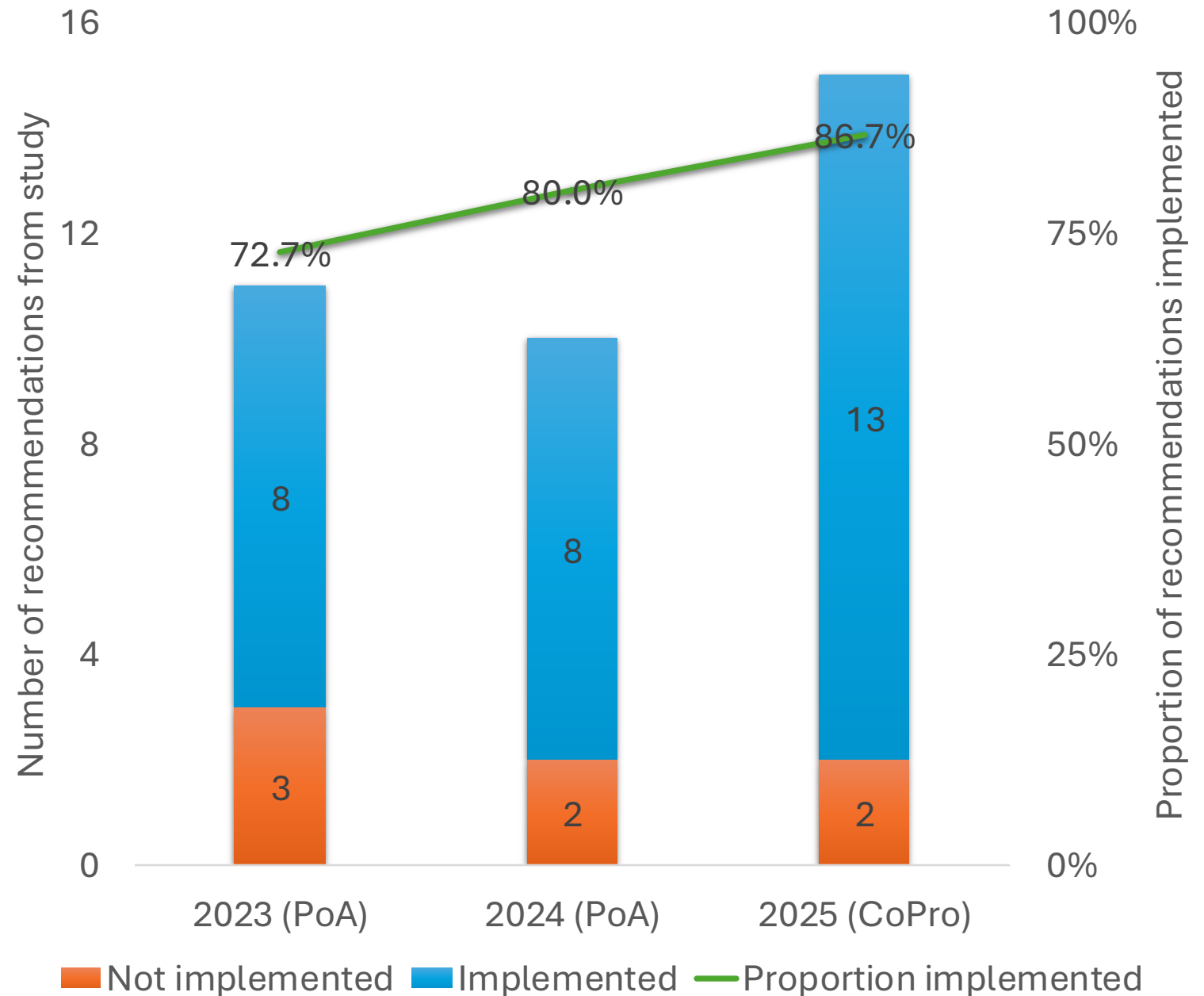


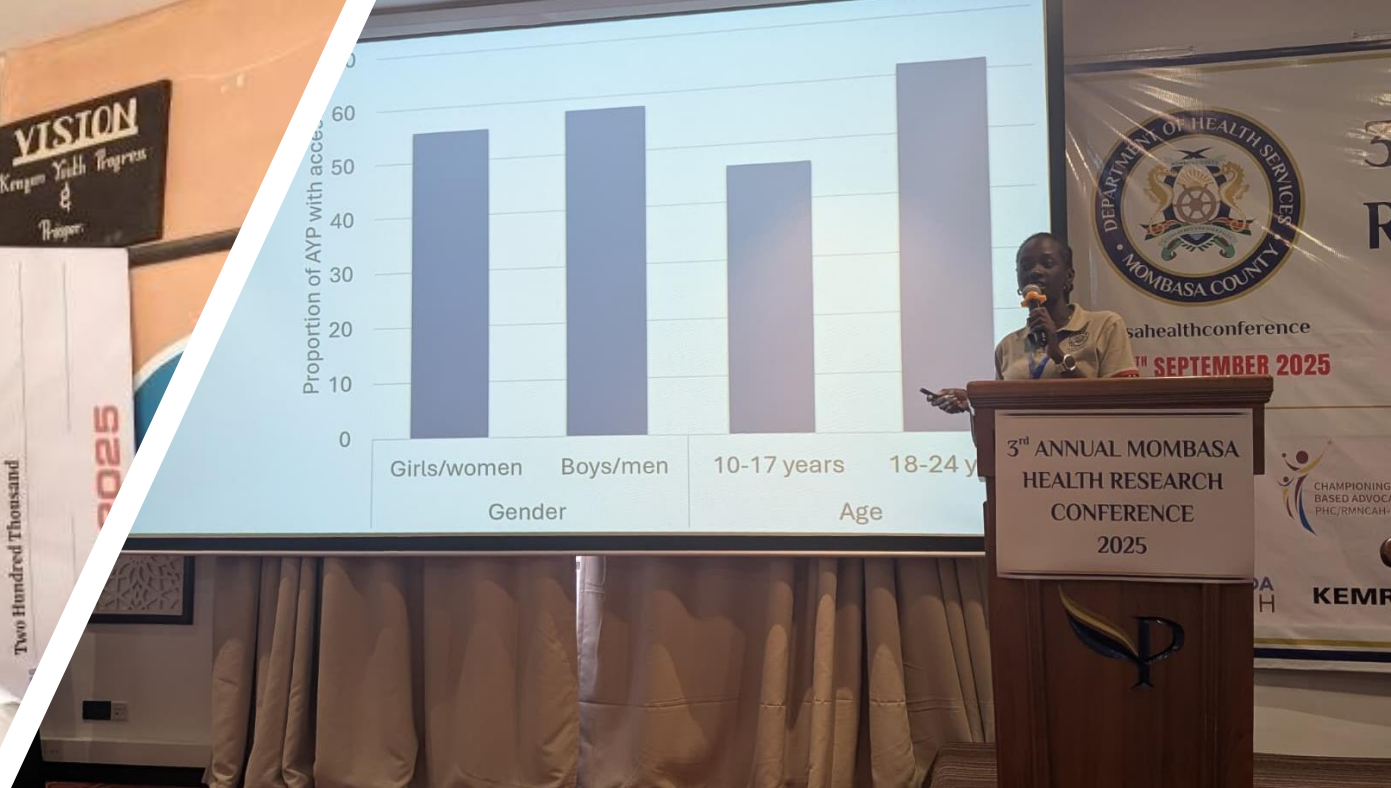


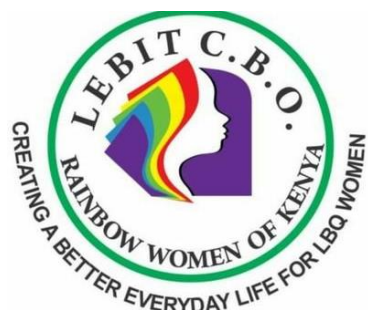
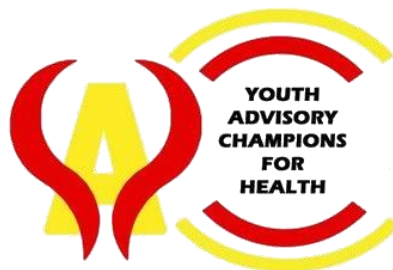
Our study's purpose

Intervention integration



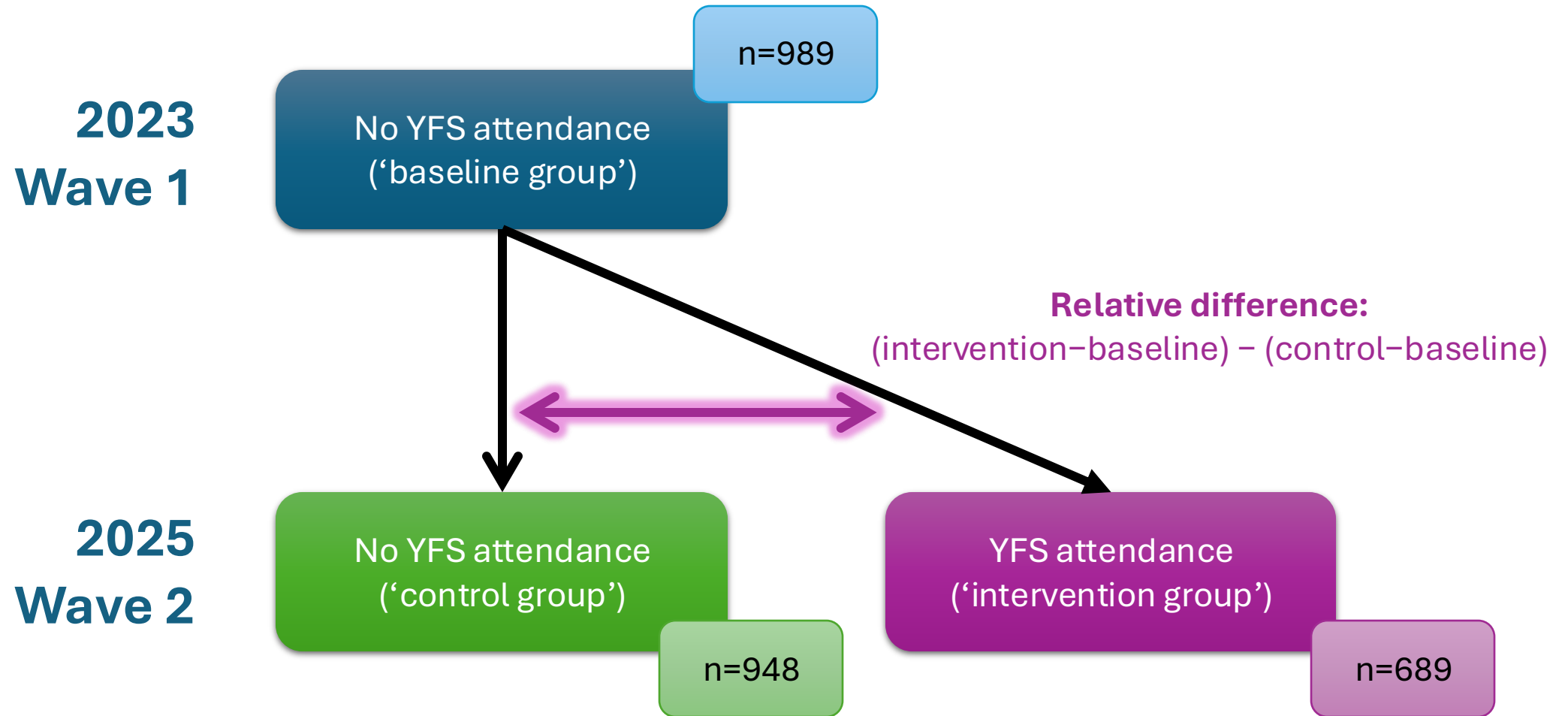




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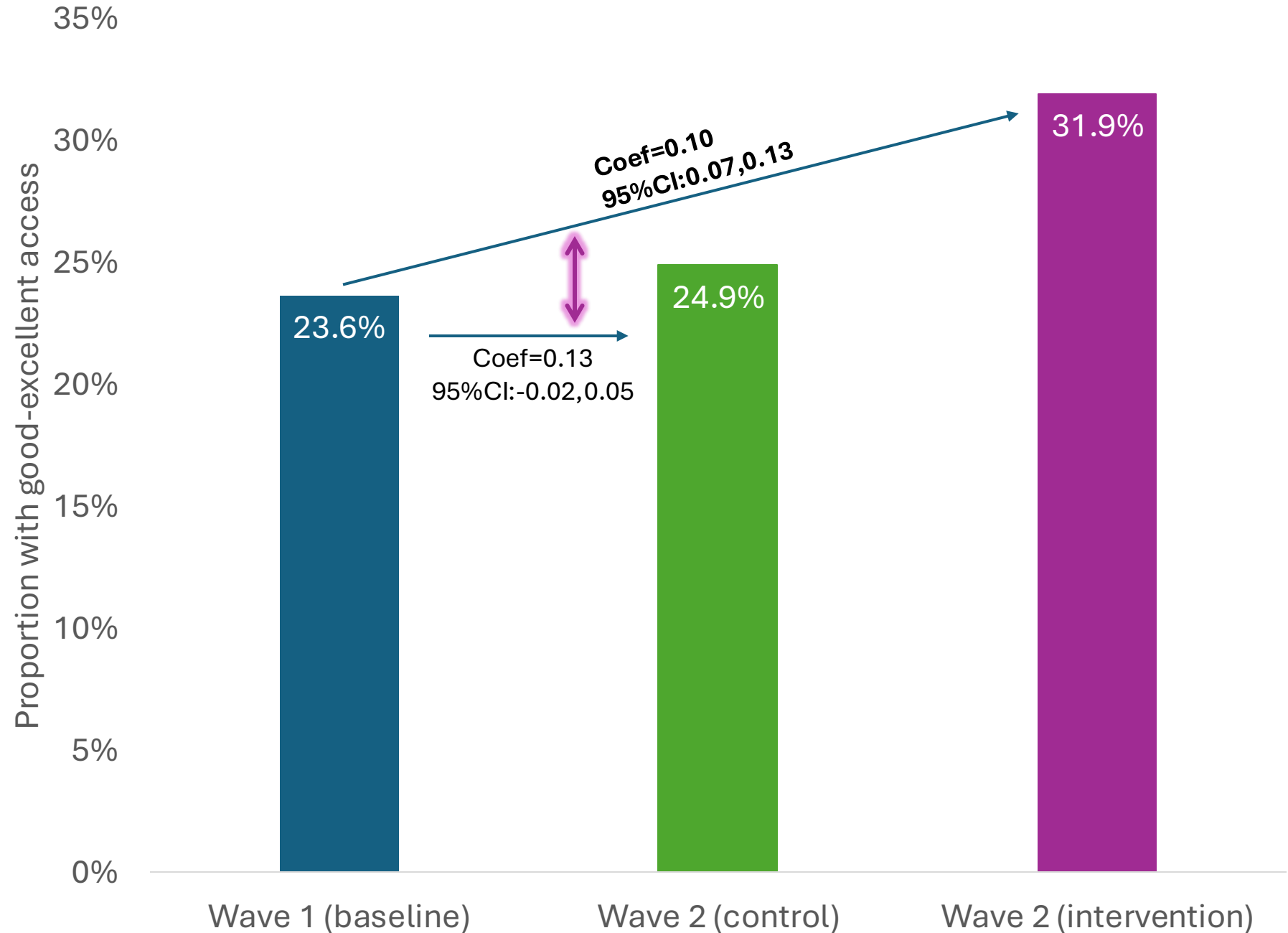
Youth friendly services Intervention impact framework

Relative difference

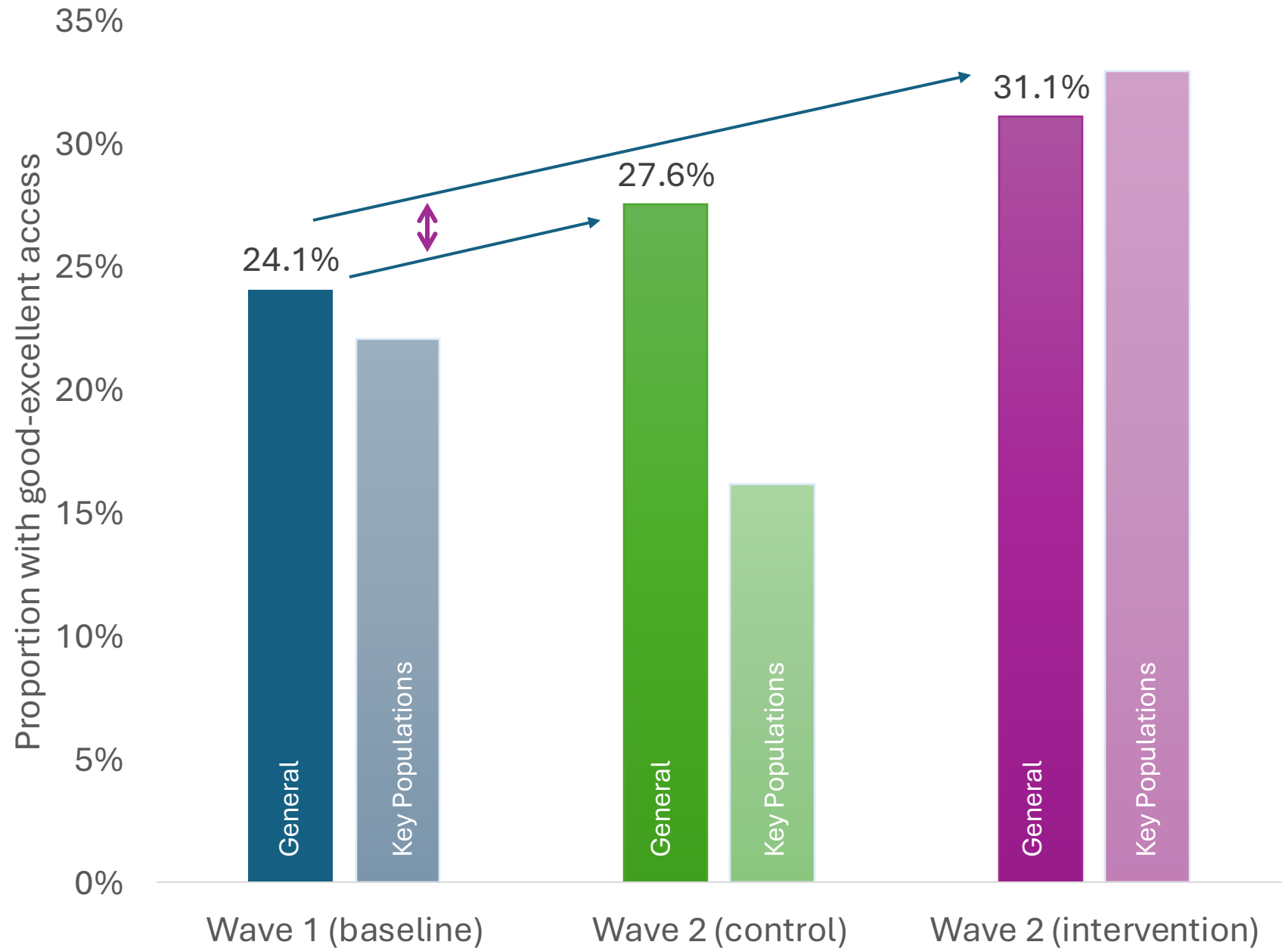
Coef=0.088

95%CI: -0.03,0.11



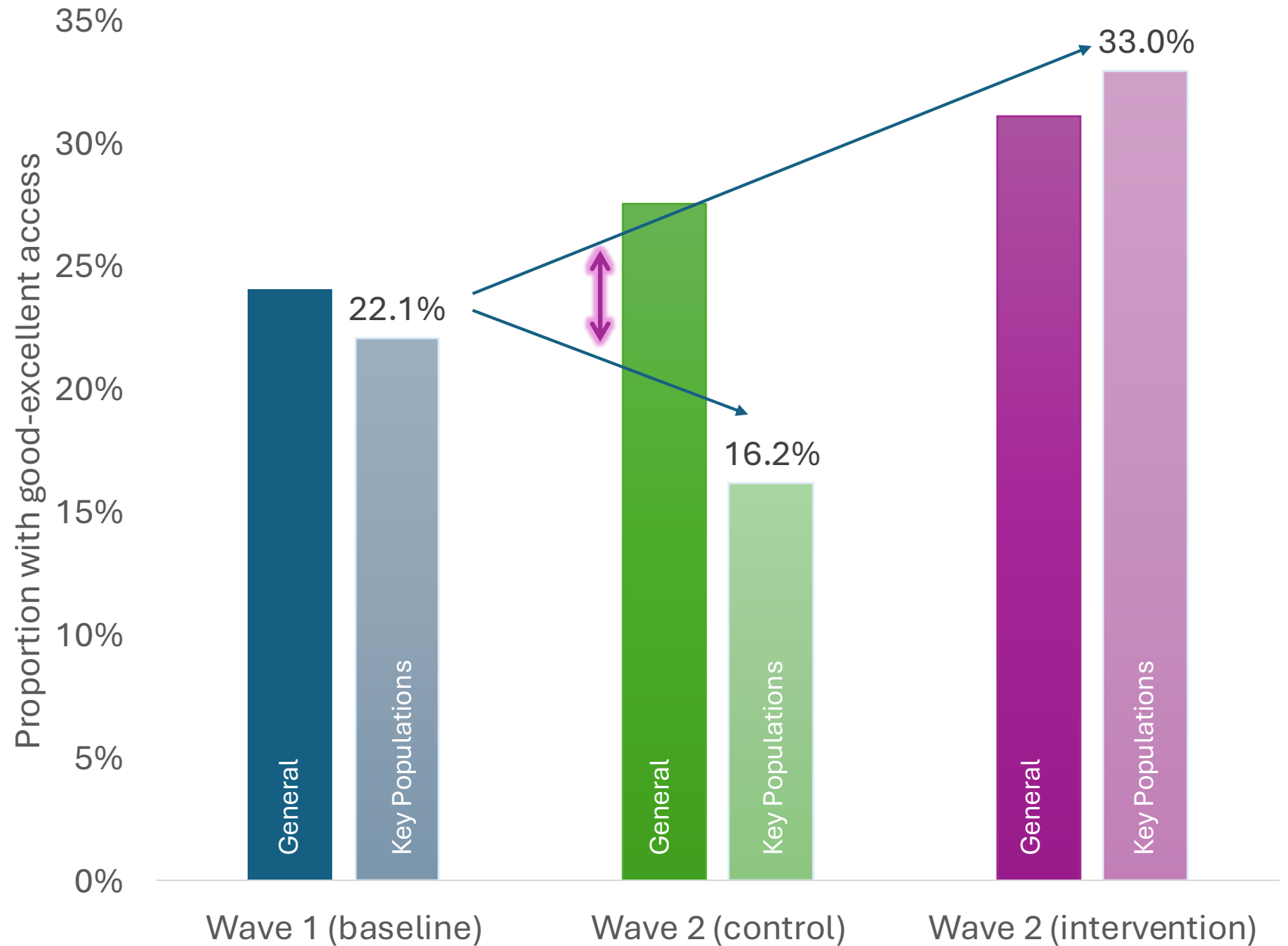
Access to healthcare (good-excellent)

Coef=0.17

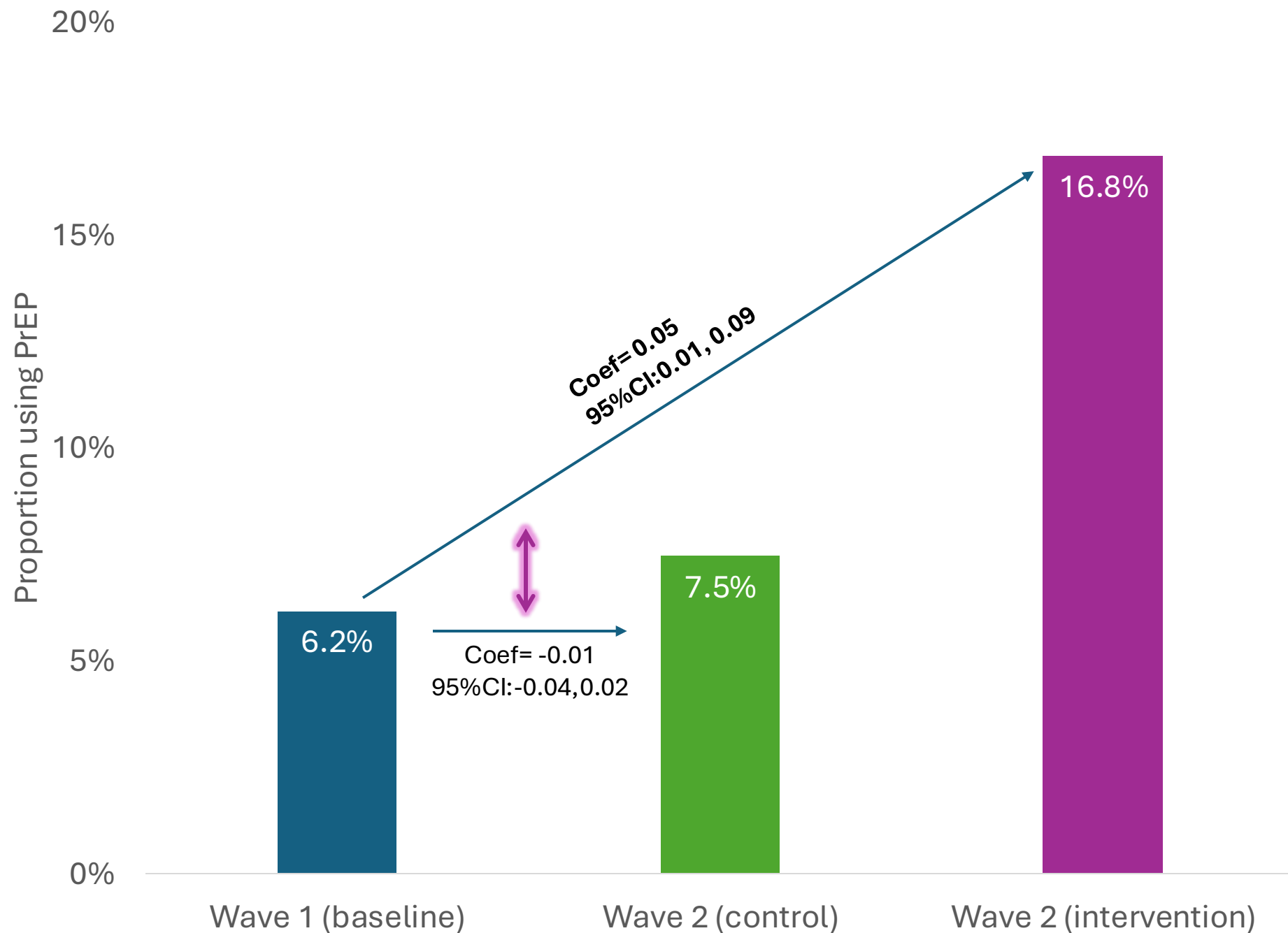

95%CI: 0.16, 0.10

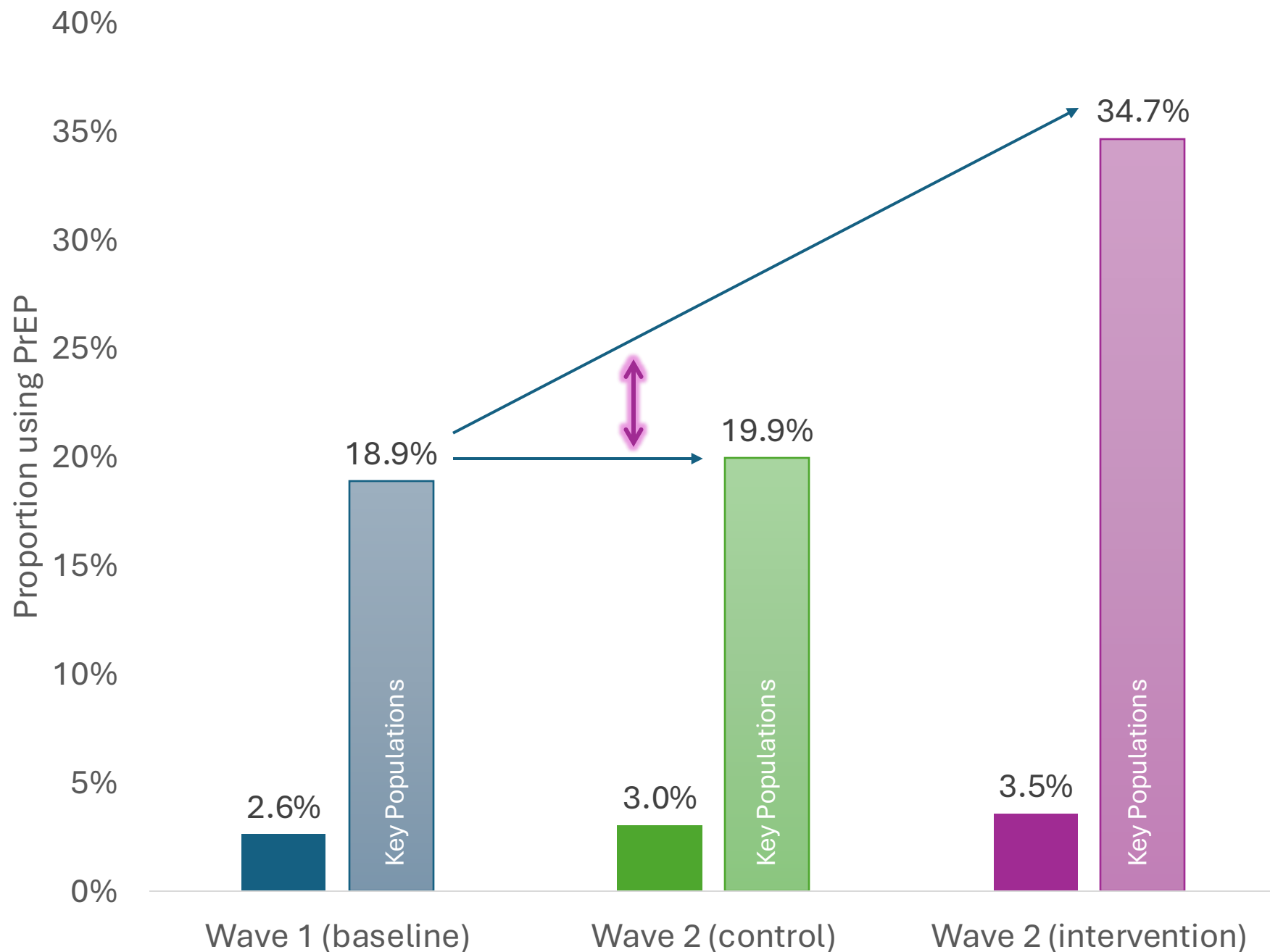


PrEP uptake
